


Joe Miller, MD, uses a simplified, portable phoropter to determine the glasses prescription for the first near-sighted patient seen in this year's brigade. Unlike in the USA, in Honduras far-sightedness far exceeds near-sightedness.

Neutralizing Lenses in the Clinic (Poor man's lensmeter)

We found that a fair number of glasses had been separated from their bags, or the tags had fallen off. How do you know what the power of the specs are when there is no lensmeter? Estimation! When a plus or magnifying lens is stacked on top of a equal minus lens, the two turn into a plain glass window and there is no magnification.




These glasses magnify the lines on the paper about 8 inches away.



This minus 4 lens takes away the magnification! The lenses are about plus four on top of the bifocal. Problem solved.

Follow-up Patient of the Day



This 47-year-old man was seen during last year's brigade. He had injured his left eye when he was a teenager, resulting in loss of the eye five years later and placement of a prosthesis. He is pictured with last year's note, which describes a concern for a rare inflammatory condition of his *uninjured* right eye called sympathetic ophthalmia. It is a frightening condition that develops in the uninjured eye, often years after the original injury. Unfortunately, it was clear at this visit that he has sympathetic ophthalmia and there was little that could be done.

Case of the Day



This adorable 7-month-old girl was brought in by her concerned mother for turning in of her left eye essentially since birth. We found that she had difficulty looking to the sides, a low and symmetric amount of far-sightedness, and normal dilated retinal exam without masses or lesions. This was most consistent with congenital esotropia, which is an indication for surgery. She will receive a referral and we asked to see her back next year.


(Not) Lost in Translation
